CALL TO ORDER:

President Ochs called the meeting of the Tremont Borough Council to order at 6:30 p.m. at the Tremont Borough Building.

Approval of Minutes:

- Motion made by Scheibley, second by Adams, approving the December 10, 2024 Meeting Minutes. All in favor; Minutes approved
- **SPECIAL GUEST:** Christian Lengle, Pine Grove Township resident and Bern Township Police Officer, addressed Council with a self-introductory speech to announce his candidacy for District Judge of Magisterial Court 21-03-04 in the Republican primary this May.

Solicitor's Report:

Attorney Shane Hobbs

- Phil Kintzel Deed
 - Requested the area on his property, as per deed, where the Cherry Street should be. The road is over to far and not located where the deed states. Mr. Kintzel wants to put a garage in that area and wants to take ownership of the small piece of land so it is not an issue in the future.
 - Atty Kelso started working on this when she was our Solicitor, now she is representing Mr. Kintzel to finish this deed.
 - o A survey was already done.
 - Solicitor Hobbs will prepare a Resolution for next meeting. Then the deed will be finalized for Council to sign and then it will be given back to Mr. Kintzel and his Attorney.
 - Motion made by Scheibley, second by Eisenacher, approving Phil Kintzel's request. All in favor; Motion passed.
- Roads to add to Liquid Fuel's Map
 - We first have to adopt the Legislative Body of the Municipality Resolution with the current Council members listed. Shane prepared the Resolution for Council to sign tonight.
 - Motion made by Scheibley, second by Strickler, adopting Resolution 01-2025, Legislative Body of the Municipality for the dotGrants online reporting system for PennDot. All in favor; Resolution Adopted.

 - Hobbs will follow up after Resolution is submitted to PennDot.
- Josh Scheibley is requesting a Municipal Driveway Permit to be submitted with his building permit.
 - Solicitor Hobbs feels that a permit is not applicable in this situation at this time. If Mr. Scheibley would need or want a permit in the future, Hobbs recommends applying for it once the property is assigned a legal postal address.
 - The secretary will inform Marty Sowers that no permit is needed with the building permit application.

- PPL Issues
 - Joanne Stehr and Dave Argall are involved now and PPL is working to address the problems in the Borough.
- Scheibley read the following letter from Comcast:

As you may know, the application window for the Broadband Equity Access and Deployment (BEAD) grant program opened on November 22, 2024. Funding from this program may be awarded to an internet service provider to bring broadband to up to 3,051 currently unserved locations in Schuylkill County. Pennsylvania has been allocated \$1.16 billion for this program, and providers will be submitting applications by January 21, 2025.

Comcast intends to apply for funding in Schuylkill County, and your municipality includes unserved locations that lie within their potential project area. Because the County is committed to bringing service to those locations, and because Comcast works closely with the communities they serve, the County is reaching out to the municipalities listed below that are expected to be included in Comcast's application.

To provide you with more information about the BEAD program and application process, and what to expect if Comcast is awarded a Schuylkill County project, including specific locations, timeline, and the services we hope to provide your residents, the company is holding an information session with in-person and virtual attendance options.

- Updates on burned properties
 - Barry Noll's property- The Contractor is done but the Demo work is not complete.
 - 312 & 314 E. Main Street- Marty Sowers posted both properties to be demolished, no work has been started.
 Butch Koehler reported that people are going in Wagner's house through the basement.
 - The Secretary requested that in the event of a fire in the future, no demolition work begin until after the escrow money is received. There was a situation with the Randazzo property where the work was done before the escrow money was received and they were told by a borough official that the secretary would cut them the check. When in fact, the Borough should not be involved with anyone other than the Insurance company. Scheibley agreed and said that we shouldn't be involved in anything other than the Escrow.
- Scheibley reported that the roof of the TACC building is leaking. He will get someone in to fix it.
- Scheibley got the quote from Werner Lumber for the doors at the Library: \$1,310.14 per door.
- Scheibley got the quote to polish the floors at the Borough Building: \$1,349.00 for upstairs and \$466.55 for downstairs.
 - Motion made by Strickler, second by Adams to table this until March or April. All in favor; Motion passed.
